TERMS OF REFERENCE

The Cabinet Committee for Disposal of Legislative Cases (CCLC) shall have the following ToRs:-

- i. Examine the cases of fresh legislation as well as amendments to the existing laws and give its recommendations whether they are to be introduced in the Parliament or otherwise, subject to ratification by the Cabinet.
- ii. Cases relating to the Rules proposed to be framed/amended by the Federal Government, subject to ratification by the Cabinet.

ECONOMIC COORDINATION COMMITTEE (ECC)
OF THE CABINET

CHARTER

1. Consideration of all urgent economic matters and coordination of economic policies initiated by various Divisions of Government.
2. To identify and propose measures for the gradual attainment of the status of a welfare state.
3. To maintain vigilance on the monetary and credit situation and make proposals for the regulation of credit in order to maximize production and exports and to prevent inflation.
4. To determine the future pattern of growth of agriculture and industries.
5. To review from time to time country's import policy and its effect on production and Investment.
6. To evaluate export performance from time to time in relation to specific policies and measures for the promotion of exports.
7. To watch the current price situation with a view to ensuring the stability of the prices of goods used by the common man.
8. Implementation of any other task assigned by the Cabinet from time to time.
9. Cases of agreements and licensing for oil prospecting and exploration.
10. Overseeing the performance of important Autonomous Bodies.
11. Cases of Industrial sanctions where powers have not been delegated to subordinate authorities.
12. Tariff problems and cases involving fiscal anomalies.
13. Review of major social and economic surveys such as Labour Force survey, Demographic survey, Household Income and expenditure surveys, Census of Large scale Manufacturing Industries and Survey of small and Household Manufacturing Industries.
14. Half-yearly review of implementation of industrial projects in private sector.
15. Reviewing from time to time the energy requirements and its effect on production and investment.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE OF THE NATIONAL ECONOMIC COUNCIL
(ECNEC)

CHARTER OF FUNCTIONS

- i) To sanction development schemes (in the Public Sector) pending their submission to the National Economic Council.
- ii) To allow moderate changes in the plan and sectoral re-adjustments within the over-all plan allocation.
- iii) To supervise the implementation of the economic policies laid down by the Cabinet and the National Economic Council.
- iv) Reports asked for by the Committee in pursuance of its earlier decisions.
- v) Any other matter referred to the Committee by the Prime Minister, the National Economic Council, the CCI or the Cabinet or raised by a member in the committee with the permission of the Chairman.



CABINET COMMITTEE ON RESTRUCTURING (CCOR)

TERMS OF REFERENCE (TOR)

- i. To review the administrative structure of Ministries/Divisions/ Departments/Autonomous Bodies (ABs) and Public Sector Enterprises (PSEs) for identification of overlapping functions, over-employment and redundancies;
- ii. To take steps for rightsizing the Ministries/Divisions/ Departments/ABs and PSEs with the aim of improving their efficiency and working and of reducing burden on the national exchequer; *and*
- iii. To restructure the Boards and Managements of ABs/PSEs and to direct them for the preparation and implementation, after necessary approvals of their own restructuring plans.



CABINET COMMITTEE ON ENERGY (CCE)

TERMS OF REFERENCE (TOR)

- i. To ensure the smooth implementation of energy projects currently underway or in the pipeline, in particular projects falling under the umbrella of the China Pakistan Economic Corridor, well within timelines stipulated for these projects;
- ii. Identify and remove bottlenecks in the expeditious implementation of these projects;
- iii. Identify the flaws and deficiencies of the existing legal and institutional framework governing the energy sector and formulate reform initiatives;
- iv. Review the current energy policy and remove its weaknesses; and
- v. Conduct inter-ministerial coordination whenever required, but at least once every fortnight.

CABINET COMMITTEE ON PRIVATISATION (CCOP)

TERMS OF REFERENCE

Reference:- The Cabinet Committee on Privatization shall have the following Terms of

- i. To formulate the Privatization Policy for approval of the Government/ Cabinet.
- ii. To approve the State Owned Enterprises to be privatized on the recommendation of the Privatization Commission or otherwise.
- iii. To take policy decisions on inter-ministerial issues relating to the privatization process.
- iv. To review and monitor the progress of privatization.
- v. To instruct the Privatization Commission to submit reports/information/data relating to the privatization process or any other matter relating thereto.
- vi. To take policy decisions on matters pertaining to privatization, restructuring, deregulation, regulatory bodies and Privatization Fund Account.
- vii. To approve the Reference Price in respect of the State Owned Enterprises being privatized.
- viii. To approve successful bidders.
- ix. To consider and approve the recommendations of the Privatization Commission on any matter.
- x. To assign any other task relating to privatization to the Privatization Commission.



CABINET COMMITTEE ON CHINA-PAKISTAN
ECONOMIC CORRIDOR (CCoCPEC)

TERMS OF REFERENCE

The Cabinet Committee on CPEC shall have the following Terms of Reference:-

- i. To periodically review work program of all Working Groups of CPEC;
- ii. To resolve inter-ministerial issues and ensure timely completion of approved projects;
- iii. To develop and implement integrated approach on Long Term Plan of CPEC, with special focus on investment and industrial development; and
- iv. To approve the agenda of Joint Cooperation Committees (JCCs) of CPEC and monitoring the implementation of decisions of JCCs.

THE CONSTITUTION OF THE ISLAMIC REPUBLIC OF PAKISTAN

National Economic Council

Article 156: –

- (1) The President shall constitute a National Economic Council which shall consist of:
 - a) *The Prime Minister, who shall be the Chairman of the Council;*
 - b) *The Chief Ministers and one member from each Province to be nominated by the Chief Minister; and*
 - c) *Four other members as the Prime Minister may nominate from time to time.*
- (2) The National Economic Council shall review the overall economic condition of the country and shall, for advising the Federal Government and the Provincial Governments, formulate plans in respect of financial, commercial, social and economic policies; and in formulating such plans it shall, amongst other factors, ensure balanced development and regional equity and shall also be guided by the Principles of Policies set out in Chapter-2 of Part-II.
- (3) The meetings of the Council shall be summoned by the Chairman or on a requisition made by one-half of the members of the Council.
- (4) The Council shall meet at least twice in a year and the quorum for a meeting of the Council shall be one-half of its total membership.
- (5) The Council shall be responsible to the Majlis-e-Shoora (Parliament) and shall submit an Annual Report to each House of Majlis-e-Shoora (Parliament).
